The following information is provided to assist visiting teachers and group leaders in completing their own risk assessment prior to their visit. It is not intended to be a replacement for a group leader conducted risk assessment.

We recommend that you make a preliminary site visit if you are going to be leading a group to Newcastle Castle. You can organise this either by telephone (0191 230 6300) or emailing the Learning Officer (<u>learning@newcastlecastle.co.uk</u>) Preliminary visits are free and are useful both for planning the educational content of your visit and making you aware of possible safety issues.

Teachers and supervisors of educational parties are ultimately responsible for the safety and behaviour of their students while on site. Newcastle Castle's staff and volunteers will help to facilitate educational activities and give out safety advice on the day where necessary, but it is up to you as the group supervisor to monitor students and ensure their safety and co-operation.
